Become a CGVRC Research Fellow

The Chicago Gun Violence Research Collaborative (CGVRC) Fellowship Program offers up to 12 three-month fellowships to highly talented and committed graduate students enrolled in graduate and professional programs at the University of Illinois Chicago School of Public Health, DePaul University, Rush University, Loyola University Public Health Sciences, and Adler University.

The Fellowship provides a \$1,000 cash award for engaging with interdisciplinary teams of graduate fellows across Chicago universities in a meaningful research project focused on producing epidemiologic profiles and mapping youth violence prevention assets for two Chicago neighborhoods highly impacted by gun violence.

Fellows will be trained and mentored in conducting community research and asset mapping. During a three-month period, fellows will engage in field work, epidemiologic reporting and the production of community-friendly informational materials (asset maps, statistical summaries, infographics, story boards and slide sets).

Through funding from the Sinai Urban Health Institute, the CGVRC Research Fellowship Program supports future professionals who have the passion and ability to positively effect change that reduces gun violence in Chicago neighborhoods and promotes youth opportunities.

CGVRC Fellows come from diverse social, academic and economic backgrounds and must be in good academic standing, enrolled in at least 6 credit hours, and have taken 12 graduate credits.
