



Become a Chicago Gun Violence Research Collaborative Fellow

Application Period: November 8 – December 10, 2021

Fellowship Period: January 15 – May 14, 2022, Saturdays from 11 AM – 1 PM (we will have 6 in-person meetings and 9 Zoom meetings)

Since 2017, the Chicago Gun Violence Research Collaborative Fellowship Program has supported graduate students who want to positively affect change that reduces gun violence (<https://www.cgvrc.org/>).

Through funding from the Sinai Urban Health Institute, the Fellowship brings together a cohort of student fellows (graduate students from Chicago-based universities) to work with faculty fellows (professors and public health professionals), to develop, implement, and disseminate an applied research project related to gun violence. This year, we will be partnering with a youth-serving organization in the Roseland neighborhood of Chicago to examine community needs related to gun violence prevention and assess ideas for change to address gun violence.

The fellowship goals are for student fellows to:

- Understand the root causes of gun violence from a public health perspective
- Learn from a network of leading gun violence scholars, advocates, and stakeholders through presentations and discussions
- Collaborate with a community partner to develop, implement, and disseminate an applied research project related to gun violence

The fellowship will be open to graduate students who:

- Come from an academic background related to violence or it's risk and protective factors (public health, medicine, the behavioral sciences, health or social services, etc.)
- Are enrolled in a graduate program in Chicago
- Are in good academic standing
